



It is necessary that we continue to pray especially for victims of abuse within the Church, for healing and consolation for those who have been so gravely wronged. 40 DAYS FOR LIFE

On Saturday 22nd of February the 40 Days for Life Lenten Prayer and Fasting Vigil for an end to abortion will commence with the celebration of Holy Mass at 1pm in St Andrew's Cathedral. Archbishop Tartaglia will be the celebrant. The 40 Days for Life Vigil will then take place as before from Ash Wednesday, 26th February, from 8am until 8pm each day outside of the Hardgate Road entrance to the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital (QEUH). The Vigil will close on Palm Sunday 5th April at the QEUH. Please consider what you are going to do for Lent. Come and pray for a culture of life here in Scotland and around the world. If you would like more information then please contact Ogilvie1615@outlook.com. This is a worldwide campaign, composed of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigils and community outreach. It has inspired over a million volunteers around the globe. Its successes are impressive: 16,742 children saved from abortion; 196 abortion workers converted; 104 abortion centres closed.


ABORTION

THE LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH IN 2019

Abortion was the leading cause of death in 2019. Right to Life UK reports that abortion was the leading cause of death across



the world in 2019. More than 42 million abortions took place across the planet last year, which compares to 21.2 million deaths due to illness, including cancer. According to the Worldometer site, there have already been approximately 1,500,000 abortions already in 2020. The number of abortions in Scotland reached a ten year high in 2018, totalling 13,286. This included an increased number of abortions for chromosomal 'abnormalities' such as Down's Syndrome. Nine in ten babies with Down's Syndrome are aborted in the UK. The number of women presenting for repeat abortions also increased in Scotland, rising 11% between 2017 and 2018. It is a tragedy that abortion is seen as the only option for many women. A society that allows a woman to terminate the life of her unborn child is not a loving, compassionate society; it is a society that sees the weakest and most vulnerable as dispensable, and it is a society that has failed its mothers. Instead of promoting abortion, society through governments and elected representatives ought to be standing up for its youngest members and challenging the abortion culture.
